Happy Holidays!

Mark your calendars for Horsefest January 19 - 20 where Christi Rains will be doing a Parelli Seminar which we just learned will benefit the Youth Foundation. See the Parelli Clinic article below for more details and links for scholarship information. Note new location for this event is Conroe, Texas.



The board is working on the details for the Youth Scholarship program which will be announced soon.

The Clinics Committee is making final arrangements for the Travis & Kathy Braden Clinic at on January 26-27. A flyer will be going out soon with all the details.

The Fiesta Show Committee has started work on the 2008 show - see Show Manager Bill Eash's report in this Echo.

Our Spring Open Show date is March 29. Check the AAHA website for upcoming information on that.

The AAHA board voted to donate \$500 to the Arabian Horse Foundation, which is a new 501 (c) 3 that will focus on several areas for funding: Youth and Scholarships; Education and Equine Research with a focus on diseases and illnesses that affect our breed of horses, and a Displaced Horses funding category. The unique feature of the Foundation pledging is that you, the donor, can designate where you want your contribution to go.

At the recent AHA Convention, a major "challenge" pledge was given by Foundation Board member Lollie Ames of Cedar Ridge Farms, followed by many regions, clubs and individuals walking to the microphones placed throughout the convention floor, pledging funds to the new Foundation, also many pledged in memory of a loved one. When, finished the Foundation had received over \$100,000 in pledges. AAHA, Dian Deal and Dale Harvill were among those making pledges from Region 9.

Since we can designate what our \$500 be used for, Treasurer Bill Eash requested that the donation go towards founder research as suggested by boardmember Jeanene Pegg-Hundley at the December board meeting.

AAHA boardmembers also voted unanimously to again support the Freedom Classic with a \$500 donation. We received a very nice thank you from Mickey Aboussie thanking AAHA for its continuing support.

AHA Convention 2007 by Bill Eash

Convention this year was held in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The city invited AHA to have our convention in their fine city so that we could take a look at the equestrian facility. The facility will be the home of the US Nationals beginning in 2008. We toured the 240-acre facility for an evening of fun, stopping at three different areas so we could tour the barns. The facility has a very flexible configuration. There can be approximately 3500 stalls and seven or eight covered arenas based upon how it's configured. The facility is almost all new.

We enjoyed a party at the main ring with a band that played music of the 60s, open bar and lots of very good food - they were out to impress us. I think it will be a very satisfactory place for us to go show our horses. The good part is that it is in Region 9 and it will not be such a far ride for our horses.

We had some very significant resolutions pass this year and some that were defeated. As of December 2008, Class A shows can have dual shows where there can be two judges in the ring. Each judge will pick his winners so there will be two sets of winners. The judges will not work together but will provide independent results. The intent was to allow areas where there aren't many shows to provide more qualification opportunities for their exhibitors. For show management and exhibitors the costs will be higher due to the additional ribbons, awards, office fees and judge. The benefit to the exhibitor is that they could win double points, but show management will have to consider whether class entries will be reduced due to the costs/double points. We will do a survey to get your opinion on what we should do for the 2009 show.

There was much discussion on whether we should make the new halter judging rules an option or mandatory. The rule will be mandatory as of April 1 2008. There were a series of changes in heights to the jumping rules to create a smaller range of heights for the exhibitors. The incentive points awarded for Dressage tests was lowered slightly since it was felt that a 55% was really to low to award an incentive point.

Convention for 2008 will be held in Denver Colorado. AAHA selected Bill Eash, Jeanne Harford and Liz Williams as delegates for 2008, at the December membership/BOD meeting. Margo Shallcross was selected as the alternate. Margo will be the voting delegate if one of the three cannot attend a meeting or if AAHA has more than 150 voting members as of June 30, 2008. We currently have 130 voting members. The delegates are asked to attend the three Region 9 delegate meetings and the national convention.

Alamo Spring Fiesta 2008 by Bill Eash

Plans are underway for a big show in May. We have hired a US Nationals Western Judge, Judy Kibler, and our Sport Horse judge will be Carter Bass. Both of these are well-respected top-notch judges.

The show committee met recently and has assigned some duties for the committee members. This year we have changed the schedule, shortening Saturday night and moving around a number of classes. We will be having all the halter classes on Friday morning and trail on Saturday morning. Saturday night has been shortened and we have added two more money classes. We will have a qualifying PB Western Pleasure Open class with money added and a portion of the entry fee jackpotted. We also added a money added/Jackpot Pro-AM Hunter Pleasure class for both HA/AA/PB. This class is not a qualifying class but will be a fun class where an amateur will ride the horse one direction and the professional will ride in the second direction.

The plan is to add \$300-\$500 to these classes and have an entry fee of \$50.00. AC Rodriguez has offered to again sponsor the money added Liberty class on Saturday night. The evening should prove to be an exciting show followed by our exhibitor barn party.

PARELLI CLINIC BENEFITS REGION IX ARABIAN HORSE ASSOC YOUTH

Sign up for a Level 1 Parelli Clinic, January 19, 2008, at the Lone Star Convention & Expo Center in Conroe, TX. The Clinic will be taught by Parelli licensed 3-Star Instructor, Christi Rains, and will benefit the Youth Foundation Region 9 AHA, Inc. Scholarship Fund. The event is open to all breeds. Parelli Natural Horsemanship will teach you to relate to your horse using psychology and understanding versus mechanics, fear and intimidation. The first six students to register for the day will be able to participate "hands on" with their horses, You are invited to come watch these students and learn how to get better results, added safety and how to have incredible amounts of fun with your horse!

There will be other activities that day also, beginning with the Region 9 High Point and Working Western Awards Luncheon. A Silent Auction will run throughout the day with some very exciting items. The day will end with the Horseman's Banquet consisting of the Region 9 Stallion Service Auction, the conclusion of the silent Auction, and the Region 9 Horseman's Awards. Ticket sales for both events will go to the Youth Foundation and this year the theme will be Texas casual for the day.

The Youth Foundation Region 9 AHA, Inc. was created in the 1980's to raise funds for scholarships to be awarded on a needs basis to deserving youth in the Region 9 area: Texas Louisiana, Oklahoma and Arkansas. Youth Foundation AHA Region 9 is now a 501c (3) charitable organization recognized by the Internal Revenue Service. Region 9 AHA hosts a Stallion Service Auction each year in January and donates 50% of the funds raised to the YF. These funds are then combined with other YF fund raisers to establish each year's award amounts for scholarships. Over \$250,000 has been awarded in years past for scholarships to the outstanding youth of Region 9 that have graduated college to become veterinarians, doctors, accountants, lawyers, researchers and horse trainers.

As you can see this will be a great day for the Youth Foundation. They hope to have you come and enjoy the clinic, share a lunch with the High point winners and relax in the evening at the Horseman's Banquet.
